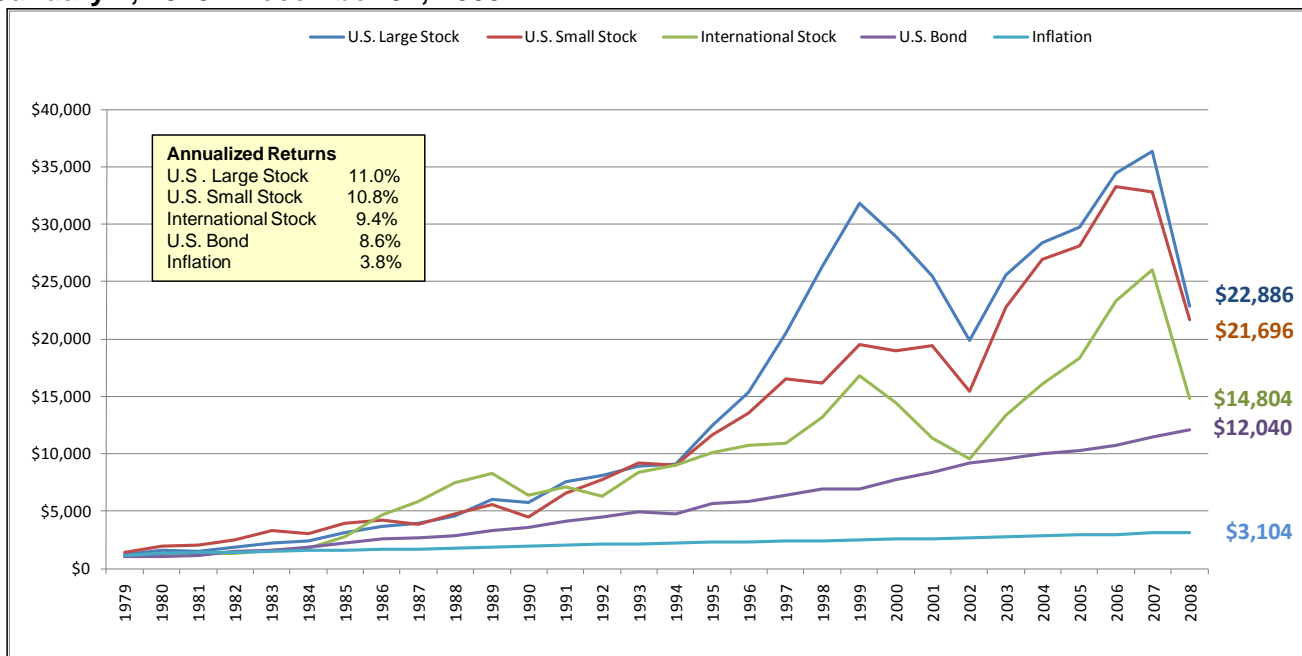


Stay Focused

Over the long term, the stock and bond markets have historically been sound investments. This chart illustrates the hypothetical growth of inflation and a \$1,000 investment in four asset classes over the past 30 years. As you can see, since the start of 1979 through the end of 2008, large U.S. stocks provided an annualized rate of return of 11.0%, international stocks an annualized rate of return of 9.4%, and U.S. investment grade bonds an 8.6% annualized rate of return.
